It is my pleasure to address the Club 300 members who support emergency services at Methodist Hospital. With your generosity, you are providing much needed funds to this critical department which offers 24/7/365 emergency care in our community.

The COVID-19 pandemic has certainly brought on new challenges to our community and Methodist Hospital. Our Administration and staff responded quickly to ensure the Hollfelder Emergency Care Center was prepared to treat patients who arrived with COVID-19 symptoms as well as all emergency health situations. We have erected a coronavirus triage tent in the ER parking lot, where patients can be evaluated and tested. You will undergo a thorough screening, very likely before you even step inside, we are screening every patient for COVID-19, even those with time-sensitive heart attack and stroke symptoms. The screening takes place before you even go to the door. Our ER staff is posted inside to handle them, or evaluations

may take place while patients are in an ambulance or their cars.

One of the trends many hospitals have experienced is a sharp decrease in patients seeking care for non-coronavirus-related ailments, likely due to fear of contracting the virus in the hospital. Those fears are not only unfounded, but they can lead to serious complications down the road. Don't Delay -- Seek Care When Needed. We want to assure you, at Methodist Hospital, we are taking every precaution in accordance with Centers for Disease and Control and Prevention guidelines to ensure the safety of all patients and staff. You can feel confident in knowing your safety and health are our top priority.


